About the Panto

This year's Panto, *Montana Smith and the Raiders of the Lost Land* was written by two local SPAT writers, Bernadette Le Mesurier and Kelly-Maree Michael (Kelly will also be directing).

It's inspired by classic adventure serials from the 1930s and 1940s as well as their more modern counterparts, particularly *Indiana Jones and the Raiders of the Lost Ark* and visits lots of exciting locations with fun characters and a moral thread about the environment and inclusivity.

<u>Synopsis</u>

Montana Smith ('Monty'), a bumbling yet handsome archaeologist, is on a dig in Egypt with his thesis student Byron when he comes across a clue to finding the legendary sunken city of Krapllewnats.

Monty is aided by the Dean of Sydney University, Dr Carmen Tooten (also our Dame), his mentor Dr Charlton Harrison-Spinks, and YourRound, their driver/expedition aide who can pilot any vehicle despite clearly being somewhat younger than the legal driving age.

Hot on their tails are Dr Gail Friday, an archaeologist from a rival university (Melbourne, gasp!), and her assistant and languages expert, Victoria. Intercity rivalries and a romance (or two) ensue.

They are pursued by some shady characters who seek to claim the city's treasure for themselves, as well as some greedy property developers with their own nefarious goals.

From the deserts of Egypt (or is it desserts?), to the cold expanses of the North Pole, the exotic marketplaces and temples of Bali and finally to the Helensburgh glow worm tunnel and the beaches of Stanwell Park, our heroes will stop at nothing in their daring exploits across the globe to keep the secret of Krapllewnats from falling into the wrong hands!

5. Audition Process

Young Dancers (Dancing chorus)

This years show will have a specialised dancing chorus in addition to a speaking/singing chorus. It is possible to audition for both choruses – if you wish to do this, please attend **both** the Dancing Chorus Audition **and** the Young Cast member's audition.

- 1. Please attend with your parent or legal guardian. Please complete your audition application form *prior* to arriving at the CWA Hall and *please* remember to bring your tap shoes.
- In person audition is preferred however, if you are unable to attend Audition 1
 please email <u>spatpanto22@gmail.com</u> attention Isabella (the Choreographer) by 23
 Aug to express you interest. Isabella will then make contact with you.
- 3. The audition will consist of a performance of a simple choreographed piece which will be taught on the day by our choreographer. This may be individual or in small groups.

Young Cast members

- 4. In addition to a speaking and singing chorus, there are also limited speaking roles available for Young Cast Members, and a specialised dancing chorus. It is possible to audition for both choruses if you wish to do this, please attend **both** the Young Dancers (Dancing Chorus) audition and the Young Cast Members audition.
- 5. Please attend with your parent or legal guardian. Please complete your audition application form **prior** to arriving at the CWA Hall.
- 6. Auditions will consist of a group singing session of a provided song (we have also included the lyrics and a link to the song being performed below if younger children wish to learn this prior to the audition, though this is not necessary). You may be asked to sing 1-2 lines solo on the day if you are comfortable with this.

This will be followed by reading a scene from the script as a group. We have also provided the links below.
